LAKE MAINTENANCE REPORT
SEPTEMBER 2021**

Hurricane IDA left us with some tree limbs in the lake. Mike Hayes and I removed several but there are still some lots that have debris that needs to be removed.

The lights and electrical leads on fountain number #2 in the center of the lake have been replaced. Fountain #3 had a bad GF breaker and it was replaced but the motor is drawing excessive amperage and was taken to the shop for assessment. The lights on fountain #1 (closest to the club) have been sent back to the manufacturer for warranty replacement.

We encourage bulkhead replacement or repair if needed. A properly working structure not only adds value to your property, but it keeps your yard from eroding into the lake and makes it harder for the nutria to live there.

We are planning to use Weed Out to do some lake maintenance on November 10th.

Please inform your lawn crews that any trash blown into the storm drains goes directly into the lake with the first heavy rainfall!!

Be careful when applying lawn fertilizers, that they are not easily washed into the lake. City and University lakes are a prime example of algae bloom due to excessive fertilizer.

Please continue to clean up any trash that may be floating by your property. Thank You to our neighbors who lend a hand at keeping our lake looking beautiful!

GOALS FOR 2021

1. Encourage Christmas decorations along the bulkheads and streets. Cazes
2. Reduce nuisance animal populations. (Ducks, beaver, and nutria). Hays & Cazes
3. Find a person to clean floating debris from the lake.
4. Continue efforts to encourage residents to repair and/or install bulkheads. Cazes, Edwards, Hayes
